### 14/21 To elect the Chairperson

Cllr Graham Carter stood down as Chair and invited Councillors to volunteer to stand for Chair. No candidates came forward. Cllr Graham Carter volunteered that he was prepared to stand again as Chair of Hilgay Parish Council.

All present agreed by a show of hands – Cllr Annabel Charlesworth was elected as Vice Chair

The re-elected Chair, Cllr Graham Carter gave an opening statement, acknowledging 2020 had been difficult year for the Parish with the impact of Covid 19 and the recent death of Cllr Ray Houghton. Cllr Graham Carter confirmed the Parish Council will look to mark the contribution Cllr Ray Houghton had made over his long service to the community with a bench or plaque. Ten Mile Bank Riverside Academy are also planning a memorial.

Cllr Graham Carter also confirmed the War Memorial in Hilgay has now been removed for restoration and repair.

# 20/21 An open forum for Public Participation (15 mins – 3 mins per person max): an opportunity to hear from Members of the Public, Borough Councillors and County Councillors

A member of the public asked for justification into the Riverfield toilet refurbishments given the facility is not used, suggesting the money could be spent elsewhere. Cllr Graham Carter explained the Parish had received a £10k grant to complete this work and the options and costings were still being explored.

It was also noted there has been a huge increase in the number of public toilets being closed across the UK.

### 21/21 Maintenance Officers Report

Colin Wills gave his report. In addition a broken wooden bench has been dumped in the cemetery – **ACTION Colin Wills to** remove it on behalf of the **PC** 

Colin Wills reminded the PC the TMB defibrillator pads run out in August 2021

Colin requested again a date for his review and consideration of an increase in his hourly rate – **ACTION Cllr Graham Carter to agree a date with the PC** 

Cllr Norman Highnam asked if the PC insurance covers Colin for the work he does for United Charites - **ACTION Clerk to confirm** 

Cllr Peter Bates commented that the Glenn Pitt is full and will write to Mr Mellish on behalf of the Parochial Church Council to establish what is happening as this could cause flooding on the road.

### 25/21 Updates from Working Parties

- COMMUNITIONS / TECHNOLOGY (Cllrs Ryan Coogan (RC) and Norman Highnam (NH)) - RC puts updated on TMB facebook page and NH on Hilgay page. Riverside News Natalie Nabi is the new editor – sending out emails for contributions to the Summer edition to be submitted by the end of June – another celebrity has contributed. New distribution list being done
- ALLOTMENTS (Clirs Elaine Hall (EH) and Peter Bates (PB)) 4
   on waiting list now some paths have been ploughed up but
   reinstated
- FOOTPATHS (Clirs Susan Annan (SA), EH and NH) Not much happening – NH met with footpath charities - SA 5 yrs to register footpaths to ensure we do not loose them - NH getting quotes to put steps in down under A10
- PLANNING (Clirs Jane Heatrick (JH) and Andy Greening (AG)) nothing to report
- FINANCE AND RESOURCES (Cllrs RC and Graham Carter (GC)) need to meet to discuss budget
- WILD FLOWER MEADOW (Cllr Annabel Charlesworth (AC)) has a quote for posts (£260)but we need 3 quotes we allocated budget of £500 .... looks unsightly at the moment but no hurry needs a subtle delineation. Colin Wills suggested removing current posts and could put corner posts in for now.

Cllr Norman Highnam suggested a sign ie Hilgay Flower Meadow - ACTION Cllr Annabel Charlesworth to enquire about signage and posts

#### **26/21** War Memorial update (Cllr Norman Highnam)

Cllr Norman Highnam confirmed there was a weeks delay in removing the memorial due to transport issues

A test pit is being dug – bricks and rubble were the only thing holding the central column up. New foundation will be set when the memorial is repositioned. Has spoken to Natural England – want to start the process of listing it. Cllr Peter Bates suggested consideration of a time capsule. Cllr Graham Carter suggested resin could be used rather than shingle to stop weeds. Rededication ceremony will be held once its back in situ – looking at mid June to fall in with the ending of lockdown. A number of organisations including the USAF, Hilgay Silver Band and the Church have shown an interest and hopefully the school will also get involved

Cllr Norman Highnam also gave an update on Gravediggers shed - will cost thousand to do — looking at potential gazebo type structure that wont need planning regulations (photos circulated). Cllr Peter Bates commented that the bricks were handmade and can be salvaged for re-sale / re-purposing. ACTION — Cllr Norman Highnam to continue to explore options and bring back to next meeting

## 27/21 To discuss the faulty casing on the Hilgay defibrillator and agree action needed

Cllr Graham Carter paid for new keypad today - should be here soon

## 28/21 To discuss the reservation and cost of burial plots by previous residents of Hilgay who have moved away
