☺ **BROADBAND UPDATE**

Norfolk is receiving a 15 million pound package to support the rollout of superfast broadband to rural areas that the market alone will not reach. The next steps are for each local authority to tender for contractors to carry out the work, with suppliers expected to start rolling out upgraded infrastructure within a year. Internet Service Providers (ISPs) will then use these networks to offer affordable services to homes and businesses.

Current Speeds in Norfolk - Average sync speed (Mbit/s) 6.4, Percentage receiving less than 2 Mbit/s – 17.6%, Superfast Broadband availability – 28%, Broadband takeup in Norfolk – 66%

Poppy Calls is the The Royal British Legion's **Handy – Person Service**. To be eligible for help you must have served in the Forces for at least 7 days, or be the dependant of someone who has served, this includes widows, widowers, cohabiting partners or civil partners of ex-service people. The service is **free**.

CLIMBING WALL SET ON FIRE

The 8th August 2011 was a sad day for the children of Hilgay, when their climbing wall was purposely set on fire. 26 of the wall posts, a 15ft length in all, were damaged in the blaze, which was so intense that some posts have burnt right through. Thankfully none of our young Residents playing at the area at the time were hurt.

The Climbing Wall is part of the Play Trail project, opened in February of this year, which Anita Stewart, Rebecca Nicholson, and their community team worked tirelessly on for 3 years to create a stunning play area for the youngsters of Hilgay.

Norfolk Constabulary are currently conducting enquires.



The Climbing Wall has now been cordoned off by the Parish Council. After initially being horrified at the amount of damage caused – Cllr Colin Wills looked a bit more cheerful as he set to work erecting safety fencing to prevent children being tempted to take a closer look at the damage, or attempting to climb on the Wall.
