HILGAY VILLAGE MEMORIES Part 2

In the 1900s - Residents would earn an income from within the Village. Mr Johnson sold cigarettes from his house in Ely Road, and Mr Wollands, also living in Ely Road sold 'bits and pieces.

Mr W Spinks and Mr B Smalls did shoe repairs.

Mr C Everett – the hairdresser, had a salon at the end of the George and Dragon Public House.

W Dent - Butchers, would buy his stock from King's Lynn Market, and offered a village delivery service for orders (with the delivery service remaining to this day!).

Barclays Bank hired a room twice a week on Stocks Hill to provide a village banking service.

Mr B Dent repaired cycles, then went on to sell wirelesses and charged wireless accumulators. Budget Ambrose and Mr Delph were in a similar line of business.

Mr H Holman & Mr C Reeve were coalmen who delivered the coal by horse and cart.

Mr T Groom was the village chimney sweep.

Mr W Cook and Mr B Woolston were the blacksmiths and kept very busy because horses were the major transportation mode.

The Hilgay Raft Race Event and River Field was also BBC Radio Norfolk's final stop for its Sunday 'Treasure Hunt' programme. I wonder if Wally Webb had something to do with that? Thanks Wally!
