I recently set off for Las Vegas for a few days' holiday - courtesy of an amazing Christmas present from my youngest son. As one of my hobbies is doing magic tricks for my grandchildren, the magic capital of the world was a perfect place to go - and it was an unforgettable experience.

Riverside News Wood Hall – A Short History

By Tony Hall Part 2 – The Manby years

In the 1630s, the land surrounding Wood Hall was subject to a number of fen drainage schemes constructed by the Dutch engineer Cornelius Vermuyden, notably Sam's Cut Drain which cut across the estate to drain the area between the Rivers Great Ouse and Wissey to provide improved grazing and arable land. Sometime between 1650 and 1655, Woodhall was passed by marriage once more to yet another family; that of Sir John Wray MP who had married Elizabeth Willoughby. It then remained in the hands of the Wray and Saunderson families for over 100 years until it was sold by Sir Cecil Wray in 1766.

It was purchased by Captain Matthew Pepper Manby, who served in the Welch Fusiliers and fought alongside General Wolfe at Quebec. The Manby family moved locally from Denver Hall, about three miles from Hilgay. They had two sons, George William Manby (1765-1854), of whom more later; and Thomas Manby (1769-1834) who was born at Wood Hall. Thomas went on to join the navy at an early age and after a distinguished career, retired in the rank of Vice-Admiral. On Matthew's death in November 1774, Wood Hall was inherited by his eldest son, George who was to put Hilgay on the map as the inventor of many life-saving appliances.

George attended school in Downham from the age of five, where he claimed to have been a contemporary of Horatio Nelson. This is unlikely due to a difference of seven years in their ages and there is no evidence that Nelson ever attended school in Downham Market. In fact, his numerous biographies state that he was educated in North Walsham and Norwich before joining the Navy.

Manby's father was keen for him to follow his footsteps into the army, so at the age of twelve, young George found himself in the military drawing-room at the Tower of London, attending a prep school for budding artillery officers. The emphasis was on mathematics which was not really his forte. Eventually he entered the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich, where he failed to graduate after four years. As a result, he had to lower his sights and take a part-time commission in the Cambridgeshire militia where he eventually attained the rank of captain. This was an army rank and not, as stated on his gravestone in Hilgay churchyard, a Captain in the Royal Navy".

In December 1793 he married Jane Preston, the daughter of a Suffolk Rector. Her extravagance and his incompetence in matters financial led to mounting debts, forcing the sale of the Wood Hall estate in November 1797. George and Jane fled from their creditors to South Wales and Bristol where George

tried to scrape a living by writing guide books and Jane took a lover – a Captain Pogson – who subsequently shot Manby in the head and left the country, taking Jane with him. Manby survived and was promptly arrested for debt. His brother Thomas, now a naval captain, rescued him from debtor's prison and packed him off to sea as a lay chaplain.

On his return from sea in 1802, he wrote a paper about the dangers to the country posed by Napoleon, recommending his assassination and volunteering to carry it out. This offer was rejected as unstatesmanlike but he was rewarded by being appointed the Master of Yarmouth Barracks. It was while he was stationed on the coast that he started to develop his inventions.

The most important of these was the "Manby Mortar" – a device for firing a line from the shore to a stricken ship which saved thousands of lives. He went on to turn out more inventions, including an early fire extinguisher and was appointed to Fellowship of the Royal Society. Sadly, he failed to take commercial advantage of his innovations and died poor and alone, aged 89, in Great Yarmouth on 18th November 1854. He is buried and memorialised in All Saints church, Hilgay. Captain Manby always considered himself to be unappreciated which is born out by the inscription on his memorial in Hilgay church:

In the churchyard near this spot rest the bones of George William Manby Capt.- FRS A name to be remembered as long as there can be a stranded ship. He died Nov 18.1854 aged 88 years. Out of his eight brothers & sisters. The large marble stone also recorded the deaths of Mary Jane August 3rd 1772 aged 10 years. John May 20th 1783 Aged 10 and of two infants.

Advertised in the Ipswich Journal and The Times on 6th November 1797, Wood Hall is described as being situated "in a good neighbourhood with the advantage of water carriage to the capital sea port and corn market of Lynn".

Although the advert suggested that an early possession may be had, the new owner may not have moved in immediately as he had a full-time job in London and Manby did not settle in Clifton, Bristol until 1801.

The Munby's were the first local family to live permanently at the Hall since the Hawes, some two hundred years earlier. The intermediate owners all had grander estates elsewhere in the country and appear to have used Wood Hall as a second home or a hunting lodge in the season

The next generation of owners were to have a significant effect on the local area. Part three will cover this era

The Wood Hall estate is private land with no public rights of way. Please respect its owner's privacy.


