## **Hilgay General Matters**

#### **Recent Vandalism in Hilgay**

There has been some vandalism in Hilgay recently of a very unpleasant nature. Many of you will have heard about it.

Hilgay Church and the old graveyard were the targets this time. You may be pleased to know that the culprits have been identified and the police are dealing with the matter.

This is not the first time that the Church has been the victim of vandalism. It is not the only place in Hilgay vandalised in recent months; the River Field Toilet block has had repeated attacks and the toilets block serving the Church has been attacked more than once.

The latest vandalism is particularly upsetting as the old churchyard was damaged. We can all agree that this is completely unacceptable. The Parish is a friendly and happy community. It is relatively crime free and safe to live in. We all want it to stay that way. We do not want it to get a reputation – however unlikely this might be.

But we also know that stopping this type of behaviour is difficult. The Parish Council is not here to police you – it has no powers even if it wanted to. We are also not here to tell you how to live. But we do have a duty to the community to remind you all that living in an area as pleasant as ours comes with some responsibilities.

Parents and guardians – please explain to your children that this type of behaviour is not good, clever or what our community expects. You probably already do but repeating the message is surely worthwhile. Before the new school term starts I will be writing to ask all local schools to reinforce this message in their civil society lessons.

Residents - if you see suspicious behaviour report it – 100 or if very serious 999. But only be vigilant, do not be a vigilante. There is a neighbourhood watch in Hilgay which I see seems to work pretty well in the residential part of the village. Ten Mile Bank residents may want to start one themselves. The local Safe Neighbourhood team of Norfolk Police – see their website – are happy to support.

Finally, on a different but related subject. The Hilgay Playing field and surrounding area has moles so we got in the local mole catcher. Eight successfully detained. However, eight mole traps were stolen. Now this could be anybody but is still unacceptable. Do not do this.

#### **Street lighting in Hilgay and Ten Mile Bank**

A couple of issues ago we asked you about street lighting. Since then we have had a request for one additional light. The cost of this will be at least £2000-4000 to install and there will be additional running costs, which because of our use of LED lighting should be in the case of one new light be manageable.

When discussing the proposed new light your Parish Council felt that we should ask residents again for their views on the need for additional lights. To make things a little easier we have produced a short questionnaire below. If you would like additional lighting where you live, please complete the questionnaire and send it to the Parish Clerk by 1<sup>st</sup> September. Contact details are in the magazine.

However, these are not cheap to install. So we need clear reasons for any new lights. In some areas of Hilgay the Borough Council is responsible for street lighting, which might need further work.

#### **Willow Lodge**

Freebridge Housing, have an extensive building in Hilgay that lays derelict and has stood empty for a significant number of years.

The property is Willow Lodge and now it is becoming an eyesore. Clearly, an invitation for anti-social behaviour. In these days when housing is in such short supply, I find it almost criminal that such a building can remain empty and unused for such a long period of time. Surely County or Borough Council should be pushing for its' return to full use. If nothing else they must be missing out on council tax income from a number of would be residents.

Approaches to Freebridge by the Parish Council have only obtained a glib response such as 'we are looking into the matter'.

Even our MP Liz Truss appears to have had no success in gaining a positive reply or any time frame as to when the property will be made available to house people once again. There are many people who would jump at a chance to move into accommodation. Many single people (predominately men) cannot obtain social housing, so to have such a block empty seems unacceptable.

Come on Freebridge and do the honourable thing and either refurbish or demolish and rebuild on the site. Housing and a permanent home are fundamental to a good society. Perhaps it is now time for all residents to put pressure on Freebridge directly or via your Borough and County Council representatives to get this building back into use. I would urge everyone to write or e-mail all of the above and the newspapers to raise this issue.

Just to let you know that the article I wrote to Your Local Paper has prompted a response from Freebridge.

Claire the new Hilgay Parish Clerk had also written to Freebridge and to Liz Truss M.P.

The Freebridge response states that Willow Lodge is no longer suitable for modern use or conversion therefore Freebridge intend to demolish and clear the site in the next few months. Then with a clear site they intend to consider what should happen there in the future.

#### The Footpaths in Hilgay

There are many circumstances that have led to them being like this but what is most important is what do the residents want done about it

The Borough/County Councils admit that footpaths are not high up on their agendas, in fact the Parish Council has been informed that they allocate only £500 a year to maintain all the footpaths in Hilgay each year. That currently appears to enable them to do two cuts per year but those cuts seem to be at totally the wrong times of the growing season.

The finger posts to identify the footpaths were requested in November 2018 and the Parish Council were told they would be provided within six weeks Well even with my poor maths from November 2018 to July 2019 certainly seems to be much longer than six weeks and none of the finger posts have arrived.

There are some serious questions that need to be asked and answers provided. Do residents want to have access to footpaths, are they frequently used, are people happy with the current situation and condition of these paths, do people want nothing extra done?

What (if anything) are residents prepared to do to retain these paths? Would residents be willing to give up a weekend or two to have a 'cut the undergrowth' party and picnic, using their own time and money?

Would residents be willing for money from the Parish Council precept to be put towards greater maintenance of these paths above and beyond what is already being done? If so what type of sums of money should be allocated to this task?

Are there any farmers out there who could offer to help either at no cost or minimal costs?

These are some of the many things to consider, but what is clear is that the current overgrown paths are less than suitable for the public to walk and if nothing is done the situation can only get worse.

It certainly does not show off the Hilgay village in the best of light to any visitors or tourists.

Why not get involved and pass on your thoughts about this matter to the Parish Councillors. The next meeting is in Ten Mile Bank Village Hall on September the 5th 2019 and begins at 7pm. You could voice your views at that meeting in person or tell a Parish Councillors before that date so they can raise the matter at the meeting on your behalf. You can also write / email the Parish Clerk about this matter and explain your suggestions.

Please do something otherwise yet another important thing about village / country life will be lost forever.

#### **Bonfires in Hilgay**

The Parish Council has had several complaints about smoky bonfires in and around the allotments in the last few months. This is not a Parish Council subject, but we thought that a gentile request to residents for more consideration for their neighbours about bonfires would not be a bad thing.

Bonfires <u>for garden waste</u> are permitted in certain areas, which includes all the Parish. But there are guidelines:

Avoid using wet material because it produces smoke;
Do not burn garden waste on windy days;
You only have small bonfires late in the day or evening;
Always think about your neighbours; and always supervise your bonfire.

There are alternatives to bonfires. The Borough Council Recycling Site at Crimplesham takes garden waste and the BC will also provide, for a modest charge, a brown bin which it collects fortnightly from your home.

#### **Hedges at Engine Road, Ten Mile Bank**

At the last Parish Council Meeting at Ten Mile Bank on 4<sup>th</sup> July 2019 several TMB residents came to tell us their concerns about how the hedging in part of Engine Road close to houses had been cut back. The Parish Council said it would investigate.

I went to have a look and saw just how brutal the work had been. One of the concerns raised was about the possible use of weed killing chemicals; there were clear signs of its use with the grass looking burnt as it does when a chemical weed killer is used. The only thing I can say about that is that all commercial weed killers do neutralise themselves very quickly and we would have to be in direct contact and often for it to be a health risk. That is what the industry tell us and it is heavily regulated. However, I still understand residents' concerns.

I contacted the Environment Agency and the NCC who are the most obvious agencies who do this type of work. NCC told me clearly that they had not carried out this work and would generally not use weed killers on verges. The EA said that they would not do work on that site and went on to say that they would take preventative measures when doing hedging on banks etc.

This leaves the landowner as the only organisation with the equipment and reason to do this work. Unfortunately, I have not been able to find out who that might be. Should they read this, I would be happy to talk to them about the residents' concerns. 01366 380606: I am available at most times.

#### Possible wildflower meadow in Hilgay

You, through the Parish Council, own a small area of land in front of the Council cemetery by the playing field. It has not been used for anything, and since the removal of the old football hut we have been thinking what we could do to provide something other than leave it as a patch of rough grass.

We are currently investigating making a small wildflower meadow. This will look interesting, attract insects like butterflies and other pollinators, and provide a nesting site for small birds: we hope.

The main reason for choosing to do this is that it will be relatively simple and inexpensive to do and we hope will provide a pleasant spot in the village. We hope to start work on this project early next year 2020. Some of the initial work may look a bit brutal, it will be an improvement over time.


# Riverside News Parish Past and Present A Look at Local History

#### <u>CAPTAIN MANBY – LOCAL HERO</u> <u>Part 2 – The Inventor</u>

After his disastrous first marriage, bankruptcy and loss of Wood Hall, Captain Manby's fortunes turned. In 1803 he was appointed as Barrack Master at Great Yarmouth after impressing the Secretary for War, Charles Yorke with a pamphlet he wrote expressing his views on Napoleon's ambitions for invasion.

While serving in this position, he witnessed a succession of shipwrecks off Yarmouth beach including, in 1807, the wreck of the gun-brig *Snipe* with the loss of 67 lives. The ship foundered on a sandbank only 60 yards from the shore as Manby spent the night watching rescuers trying unsuccessfully to get a line to the ship in the teeth of an onshore gale.

He immediately started experimenting using a small canon which after a series of trials developed into the "Manby mortar" which allowed a rope to be successfully and consistently fired from the shore across a stranded vessel. It was officially adopted in 1814 and a series of mortar stations were established around the coast. It has been estimated that by the time of his death nearly 1000 persons had been rescued from stranded ships by means of his invention.

In the same year he married Sophia Gooch, the daughter of a wealthy squire, hoping to improve his financial position. Unfortunately, this was not to be due to the efforts of the heir to the Gooch estate, Thomas Sherlock Gooch, who regarded Manby as "a mountebank and penniless adventurer".


At around the same time, Manby went on to invent a portable, pressurised fire extinguisher which he called the *Extincteur*. Unfortunately, he did not realise the enormous commercial potential of this idea which could have made his fortune. In addition, he was the first person to advocate a national fire brigade.

His other inventions included an early breeches buoy and a system, using a ladder and wicker boat, intended to save people who had fallen through ice.

In order to once more escape his creditors, in 1821 he sailed for Greenland in the whaling ship *Baffin* with William Scoresby, in order to test a new type of harpoon for whaling which was based on similar principles to his mortar. However, his device was sabotaged by the whalers. He published his account as *Journal of a Voyage to Greenland*.

After a lifetime of disappointments his efforts were only partially recognised. The King of Denmark awarded him a gold medal in appreciation of his "arduous exertions in saving the crews of shipwrecked vessels". In 1824 he was one of more than 30 eminent gentlemen who put their names to the establishment of the RNLI at its inaugural public meeting and in 1831 he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society in recognition of his many accomplishments. His much hoped for knighthood never transpired and he had to make do with a gold Coronation Medal from Queen Victoria.

After the death of his wife in 1843 he devoted all his time to his obsession with Admiral Lord Nelson by turning his small home in Great Yarmouth into a museum dedicated to the great seafarer which sadly, was hardly ever visited.

On 18<sup>th</sup> November 1854 he died as a "tiny, shrivelled and disappointed old man" \* of 88. He was buried in Hilgay churchyard and is commemorated inside the church.
