Friday 27th July THREE BILLBOARDS OUTSIDE EBBING, MISSOURI (15)


Frances McDormand plays Mildred, who in order to stop herself drowning in grief after the brutal murder of her daughter, decides to fight back when the case remains unsolved, purchasing the titular billboards and plastering them with details of the crime and the question: "How come Chief Willoughby?" "McDormand is a force with which to be reckoned as the grieving mother desperate for the law to take its course. Fearless and lacking in vanity, she grabs this gift of a role and delivers an unforgettable performance. We feel her pain, angst, frustration and impotence. 'Looks



like we got a war on our hands' Woody Harrelson's police chief Willoughby mutters, as the town prickles at the confrontation. The ability to balance extreme violence, emotional substance to chew on and black comedy has been evident in McDonagh's work since *In Bruges*. There, he struggled to completely marry them together, but here he finds a way to keep things on track. No moment, it seems, is too horrific for humour, a stance that particularly suits Rockwell's ability to shift from comedy to danger and on to tragedy in the space of a few lines of dialogue.

Friday 31st August DARKEST HOUR (PG)

Within days of becoming Prime Minister of Great Britain, Winston Churchill (Gary Oldman) must face one of his most turbulent and defining trials: exploring a negotiated peace treaty with Nazi Germany, or standing firm to fight for the ideals, liberty and freedom of a nation. As the unstoppable Nazi forces roll across Western Europe and the threat of invasion is imminent, and with an unprepared public, a skeptical King, and his own party plotting against him, Churchill must withstand his darkest hour, rally a nation, and attempt to change the course of world history.



Riverside News Parish Past and Present A Look at Local History

Ten Mile Bank Bridge - Spanning 138 Years - Part 2 by Tony Hall

Locally, the big event of 1929 was the removal of the tolls on the bridge. Here you can see the locals clamouring to cross the river for free as a well-dressed gentleman throws open the gates.



This is a story in itself but simply, the Parish council petitioned the County Council to buy out the bridge company in order to free the bridge from tolls. The estimated cost of the buyout was £2,000; that's around £100,000 today. The parish clerk, Mr Alfred Ferguson, set about raising £750 from commercial users of the bridge such as local farmers and companies who delivered goods to the area. The rest was paid by Norfolk County Council and an official opening of the gates was performed on 11th October 1929.

The picture above dates from the 1960s. You can see the Windmill Inn and the additional pier added in 1942 to strengthen the then 80 year old bridge. In 1994, the bridge was assessed by the county council. It was found to have a maximum weight limit of three tons and was scheduled for replacement.



In August 2003 construction of the new bridge was started by John Martin Construction at a cost of £2.8m. The new bridge was opened in late 2004, the pub demolished and the old bridge removed.



And here is the new bridge in all its glory, complete with traffic lights and realigned directly opposite Station Road.


Reporting of Potholes

Thanks to dog owners.

The Parish Council noted at its last meeting that the problem of dog mess around the villages has reduced significantly in recent months, and we would like to thank all dog owners for their diligence in clearing up after their pets. This makes a really positive difference to the environment for everyone and is very much appreciated.

Parish Council hedge-cutting 2018 season

I understand that some residents in Hilgay have expressed concern about a perceived untidiness of the hedges around the playing field during the summer months, so I wanted to explain what is going on.

The hedge is home to birds' nests, and there are strict rules around disturbing birds during the nesting season, which come out of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The general principle is that is it illegal, and a criminal offence, to kill birds or disturb their nests. The penalties are an unlimited fine and jail sentence up to six months. Therefore most local authorities, and landowners, simply do not cut hedges at all during the nesting

season (taken to be between 1 March and 31 August, depending on the season). So neither Norfolk County Council nor King's Lynn Borough Council cut hedges over the summer, and if you look around other parishes, you'll see their hedges remain uncut too.

There are circumstances when hedges can be cut, such as if they are blocking views on a road and so are dangerous to drivers or pedestrians, but generally, don't cut is the rule and that's why your parish council didn't cut last year.

However, given the concern expressed by residents last year, the council has taken advice from the RSPB to see what could be done to make the hedges a bit tidier. The RSPB Wildlife Team have said that light trimming is acceptable, provided that the hedge is carefully checked for any birds' nests in any given area, and if there are, then that section is left. The parish council Maintenance Officer is aware of the restrictions and is carrying out trimming to make the hedges as tidy as possible, within the limits of what is lawful.

Please do get in touch if you have any comments or would like any more information, and in the meantime hopefully you can bear with us if the hedges look a little unkempt over the summer, and instead enjoy the sight of fledglings emerging safely!
