Please clean up after your dog

It is a criminal offence under the Public Space Protection Order (Dog Control) 2018 to allow a dog to foul in a public place and not clear up it.

If you know someone who isn't clearing up after a dog, please report it to Kings Lynn & West Norfolk Borough Council

You can make a report if you see a dog fouling incident or have information on owners who do not pick up after their dogs.

King Lynn & West Norfolk Borough Council are taking this matter seriously and have recently prosecuted a man from Downham Market who did not clear up after his dog.

He was fined £60 and ordered to pay costs of £250, plus a victim surcharge of £20, having been found guilty by the magistrates court of failing to clear up after his dog.

There has recently been a noticeable increase in dog faeces being found within our community with specific issues along the riverside at Ten Mile Bank.

Hilgay playground, field and allotment

Unfortunately it has been necessary to place mole traps in the playground, field and allotment areas at Hilgay due to the significant activity in the area.

There have been concerns raised by residents that the traps being used are illegal. The Parish Council wishes to confirm that a qualified pest contractor has been employed to manage the removal of the moles and have liaised with Downham Market Police Station.

Our local policing team have replied to the concerns of residents to confirm that:

"These traps are legal. They are an industry standard trap and widely used. They are similar to the old gin traps which are illegal. Spring traps are illegal under the small ground vermin order 1958 but these spring traps are excluded from it. They should be checked once a day under the code of practise for pest control"

The Parish Council can confirm that the traps are being checked morning and evening by our contractor.

The Parish Council appreciate that some residents would prefer ultrasonic repellents to be used however due to the number of moles this was not considered an effective method of control given activity was being also seen on the edges of the cemetery and the moles are entering the breeding season.

It has been witnessed that traps are being removed from the area. If you know who these individuals are please report them to the Police at Downham Market Police Station on a Thursday during opening hours or via 101.

Every trap that is stolen is costing you, the rate payer, £10.00 per trap.

Over 20 traps have been stolen to date.

If you wish to return any traps you have removed, without fear of prosecution, please contact the Parish Clerk on hilgayparishclerk@hotmail.co.uk and an arrangement can be made.

NHS Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) in Norfolk and Waveney exploring possible merger

The NHS clinical commissioning groups (CCGs) in Norfolk and Waveney are currently exploring whether to merge into one larger CCG and are inviting people to have their say on this proposal.



The CCGs' Governing Bodies believe there are now very clear advantages of merging. But they also say it would be essential that we keep the strengths of our existing CCGs, such as an area's strong local focus and strong leadership by local doctors and nurses.

Many CCGs in England are also merging, in line with national guidance. Dr Paul Williams, Chair of West Norfolk CCG, said: "Our CCGs have achieved many things since 2013 and we are absolutely determined that this will only be strengthened and built upon. Our work must continue to be clinically led and we are determined to build upon our many local relationships and ensure services are appropriate for local communities."

If the proposal proceeds, the CCGs would expect to submit an application to NHS England in the autumn, with the merger taking place by the end of March 2020. The CCGs are listening to partners and the public on how they think a merger could best proceed. Key Jobs to Tackle In October / November in the Garden

Rather than list hundreds of jobs to tackle I thought I would condense them to the key jobs that will keep your garden looking great without too much effort

- 1. Protect half-hardy plants with fleece or bring them into a frost-free greenhouse
- 2. Clear overhanging plants from pathways to maintain access around the garden.
- 3. Raise pots off the ground for the winter with bricks or 'pot feet', to prevent waterlogging.
- 4. Plant you spring flowering bulbs.

Autumn Spring Planter

There is a definite cooling in the air and whilst the evenings are noticeably shorter they can still be enjoyed with a small Chimenea on the patio.

I thought this month we'd have a go at planting an Autumn / Spring flowering container. You may be wondering how do you keep a container flowering for that long and the simple answer is magic.

The magic is learning how to work with nature rather than against it. The magic is achieved by layering the container with different plants and bulbs. Hopefully all will become clear when we start:

Into the bottom of a large container (my container is about 45cm in diameter and 50cm deep); fill it to about a third of the total height with a good quality All Purpose Compost with added John Innes. If your container is really large then I'd advise that you place the container in situ and raise it off the flagstones with pot feet. This will allow for good drainage and importantly if the container becomes heavy after planting you haven't then got to strain every muscle in your body to move it.

Anyhow onto this first layer add your short stemmed tulip bulbs such as Cape Cod which I'm using pushing gently into the compost. There is no need to press hard as we then fill the container with more compost to just cover the tops of the bulbs. Into the next layer we can plant our Tete a Tete daffodil bulbs again press gently into the compost and cover the bulbs so that the tips are just about hidden.

I've gone for a mixture of bulbs for my next layer by using Pansies, Forget me Nots, Polyanthus and Crocus bulbs. Same drill cover them with compost but on this layer add a little extra compost and plant the bulbs around the edges of the container. Into the centre of this top layer I planted Dwarf Wallflowers like Tom Thumb. Now I clumped 3 to 5 of them together for better effect and to give greater colour. When you're planting this top layer remember to not plant them too deep as you don't want to damage the bulbs beneath.

In early spring I'll begin to feed the container with Tomato Feed or anything with a high Phostrogen content.

Don't be afraid to have ago at planting one of these as they are so easy to do and come the spring it's like magic when the new flowers appear and grow through each other.

So head down to Baytree at Hilgay and get your spring flowering bulbs, containers and compost. Plus you'll get expert advice all thrown in.
