

OUR PARISH COMMON LAND

WE MAY NEED TO FIGHT TO KEEP IT!

Turn left at Woodhall Gates. Head East down Sandy Lane, carry on passed Gipsy Wood to the T junction, turn right heading South – you are now walking on an ANCIENT DROVE. Follow the drove to the entrance to the Bird Reserve. Turn left on to the roadway leading to the Old Pump House towards the River Wissey, keeping on the left-hand side of the drain.

The narrow strip of land on your left is Common Land



Our Parish Council believe with evidence we have and the living knowledge of our village elders, that this land has always belonged to us all. It has always continuously been walked, ran, played on and enjoyed by parishioners and their families and friends.

It seems that the land was wrongly included in a land agent survey of Woodhall Estate many years ago (a boundary line drawn in the wrong place). Different Parish Councilors have attempted over many years to get it sorted out by negotiations without success. This was probably compounded in the 60s, when all Common Lands were registered in the UK. The government after many years of wrangling decided that the paperwork and process during the 60s was not fit for purpose. The Home Secretary then made a statement that all people with an interest in those pieces of Common Land, work together and discuss the best use for all.

We may need to spend taxpayer's money to continue the fight.

Hilgay War Memorial

The war memorial in the village stands as a reminder of all the people who lived through and actively took part in the dark times that clouded the 20th century, it also proudly pays tribute to the local aircrews that lost their lives in the Hilgay Parish.

The two wars took so many lives and affected so many lives that almost all communities in this United Kingdom have found solace by creating these memorials. The local Hilgay memorial is heading for its first 100yrs anniversary and is starting to show its age.

The Parish Council has started to take steps to address these issues and to ensure that the memorial stands proud and straight for the future generations so that they can learn about the effect that wars have on communities even when they are fought thousands of miles away.

We are looking to finalise plans subject to final agreement to completely overhaul the existing structure and to replace the weather worn posts and kerbs around the memorial with new stone.

We are engaging with a local Stonemason company that is currently working at Ely Cathedral and has a good local reputation based in Bottisham near Cambridge. This alongside also engaging with the War Memorial Trust to seek advice and assistance.

All going to plan we should see activity in the area from April 2021 onwards, allowing plenty of time before the next Armistice Remembrance Day.

Something to consider for when the project is complete is, do we need to recommission the memorial, with a local event that we can engage the community with?

The Parish Council is also seeking funds, from resident's and organisations to help with the restoration.



Of course, Covid 19 has brought many changes within the Methodist Church. For example, Downham now has a weekly Zoom service normally at 6p.m on Sunday evening. People from all over the West Norfolk join in and we have also had people joining in from Zimbabwe and South Africa.

At Hilgay, we have been open for worship and had three Guild meetings when Covid regulations allow. Many thanks to Tony Hall for giving us a fascinating talk on Wood Hall and to Christine Whitehead for her very enjoyable flower arranging demonstration. We have rearranged the chapel to help prevent the spread of infection. We bought new small folding tables, so the seating is now arranged in café style seating bubbles for 1 to 4 people. All the usual rules of masks, hand sanitising and social distancing apply.

WORSHIP: Currently we only hold two services a month when we are able to open for worship. For times and dates of services, please look at the church notice board or ring me, Lesley Dent on 01366 387337. Unfortunately, we now have to ask people to book a seating bubble if they wish to come to a service or other event. If you interested in joining in Zoom worship, I can give you contact details. Sadly, as one of the things we really miss doing is singing, we won't be able to hold a Christmas Eve Carol service this year. We will be having a Holy Communion Service at 10p.m on 20th December and the West Norfolk Methodist is holding an "Advent Zoom" at 5p.m on the same day.

Conditions of Application

Grants are available to all persons aged 16 or over

Applicants must live in the Parish of Hilgay, including Ten Mile Bank

Applicants must have been on a course or in training for a period of at least three months

Applicants must be able to demonstrate that their training or course is being accomplished in a satisfactory manner

Previous applicants can apply to continue their courses or training

Grants cannot be used for accommodation, tuition fees or travel costs

Hilgay United Charities are registered with the Charity Commission - No. 208898

Hilgay United Charities (The Feoffees) - Annual Report 2019

Hilgay Feoffee Charity was founded by the will of the Reverend Nicholas Spencer in 1701 and was regulated by a scheme of the Charity Commissioners in 1871.

Originally operating as two separate charities, it is now run as one consolidated entity – Hilgay United Charities (No. 208898). Its annual returns can be found online at: www.charitycommission.gov.uk

The income of the Charity is derived from land rents, the hire of moorings on the River Wissey and funds invested in the Charities Official Investment Fund. No external fundraising is carried out. The Charity is tasked with the following:

- The maintenance and insurance of all Charity land and property in good order
- The provision of grants to both village schools to purchase additional items such as books, computers and play equipment
- The provision of Apprenticeship Grants to local young people to purchase books or equipment for further education and training
- Providing assistance to local residents with fuel costs in the winter months
- The provision and maintenance of Hilgay and Ten Mile Bank Village Halls
- Providing occasional grants for projects that benefit the local community

Since 2014, The Charity has made grants totalling over £60,000. In 2019, substantial grants were made to both village schools for books and equipment.

Grants were provided to young people in apprenticeships and further education and a number of residents received help with winter fuel costs. Grants were made to local organisations and Ten Mile Bank Village Hall had a major refurbishment.

The Trustees wish to thank the volunteers and management committee who give freely of their time to manage both village halls for the benefit of the community.

The Charity operates solely within the Parish of Hilgay with Ten Mile Bank. Its work is overseen by a body of ten Trustees, who meet three times a year. There are currently six Trustees from Hilgay and four from Ten Mile Bank. Four of the Trustees are also Parish Councillors. The Charity is administered by the Clerk - Mr Anthony Hall. The current Chairman is Mr Brian Charlesworth of Wood Hall, Hilgay and the Vice-Chairman is Mr Colin Wills of Ten Mile Bank.


